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## BITS AND PIECES AS WE HEAD INTO 2022

The holiday season is behind us and Breast Cancer Action Kingston is now looking ahead to 2022. We have some carry over projects that we will complete and we have some brand new initiatives that we are anxious to see to fruition.

With today's announcement from the Province of Ontario all our exercise programs will be suspended until such time as the government lifts the new Covid restrictions. This includes all our in-house exercise and yoga classes as well as the Aqua Fit class held at The Royale Place Residence. ## Community Outreach Program

For the second year, BCAK was successful in its bid for a \$10,000.00 grant from the Saunders-Matthey Cancer Prevention Fund. A good portion of this grant will be put towards our Community Outreach Program. The goal of this initiative is to engage with breast cancer patients in the outlying communities we support by making them aware of our existence and then finding out how we can help them.

Phase 1: to raise awareness of breast cancer and of our support of breast cancer patients in the area and (continue) to gain community recognition,

Phase 2: identify what programs / services are required outside the immediate Kingston area,

Phase 3: where possible, extend our programs into the outlying regions.

As a result of a targeted media campaign in the last 3 months of 2021, we increased our membership in 2021 to a record 164, our website reported an increase in inbound traffic in November of 90% and we worked on new exercise programs that we introduced in Kingston as soon as the lockdown was lifted.

In 2022, we will continue to make our presence known in the communities we represent, solicit participation and encourage feedback from our targeted campaigns and identify what the needs are, where they exist and how we can help.

## Certified Support Facilitators Wanted

Our facilitators are breast cancer survivors who volunteer their time once a month (or as needed) to allow women who have been affected by breast cancer to come together in a secure and safe environment to talk about their situations and concerns.

BCAK is looking for survivors interested in facilitating support groups in Kingston and in our service area - South Eastern Ontario.

At the moment we have two survivors interested in becoming facilitators so we are working on offering a certification program in 2022. ## REVIVING BCAA'S HAND'S ON PROJECT

The **Hands On** project was developed in 1996 with two main purposes:

- To create a greater awareness of the need for women to do breast self-examination (BSE) regularly and correctly,
- To provide an effective weapon in the early detection of breast cancer.

To achieve our goals we provided physicians, nurse practitioners and women's outreach clinics with Hands On kits, free of charge. Each kit contained a breast model with simulated lumps, descriptive booklets and an instructional videotape.

Over the years, the Hands On Project achieved its goals not only by providing the teaching kits to health providers but by taking those tools to the community. Educational presentations on Breast Cancer 101 and BSE were created in easy to understand formats and were presented to Personal Support Workers, Kingston Seniors Association, women's groups, International Women's Day festivities, Salvation Army Women's Day and others.

We would like to continue this important initiative and take it to our extended community. This year we will be purchasing new teaching tools, putting together a mobile programme and finding and training volunteers.

The need to help women 'Be Breast Aware' has never been more important. Early detection provides the best chance of effective treatment. Early detection of breast cancer is associated with an increased number of available treatment options, increased survival, and improved quality of life.

**This is important work and we need volunteers to help 'get the word out'. If you like to meet people in a group setting, show some slides, demonstrate BSE on a teaching model, have insight into developing a community programme - we need you. Please contact us.**

## **Breast Cancer Dragon Boat History in Canada - Dr. Donald McKenzie**

In 1996, Donald McKenzie, a sports medicine physician and exercise physiologist, initiated and developed a physical training program for the benefit of 24 breast cancer survivors. When women living with the disease began to challenge the notion that they should lead physically-restricted lives after surgery, Dr. McKenzie formed and coached the "Abreast in a Boat" Dragon Boat paddling team consisting entirely of women who have survived breast cancer. Thanks to his initiative, most provinces in Canada now have a breast cancer dragon boat team. His remarkable achievements, enhanced by his guidance and caring, have given breast cancer survivors across Canada a sense of confidence and pride, and a lifeline to a better existence.

*On December 29, 2021 the Governor General announced 135 new appointments to the Order of Canada and Dr. McKenzie was one of them.*

Her Excellency the Right Honourable Mary Simon, Governor General of Canada, announced 135 appointments to the Order of Canada. The new appointees include 2 Companions (C.C.), 39 Officers (O.C.), 1 honorary Member and 93 Members (C.M.).

Dr. Donald Chisholm McKenzie, O.C., M.S.M. from Sidney, British Columbia was appointed for his expertise in sports medicine and for his seminal research on the effectiveness of exercise as an intervention for breast cancer patients.

## A Chestmates' Christmas Gift

Once upon a time in March of 2002, 27 strong and spirited women, with the support of Breast Cancer Action Kingston ("BCAK"), joined to form the Chestmates Dragon Boat Team: a team of breast cancer survivors. They paddled to slay the "evil" dragon of breast cancer and to enrich their lives through the creative fire of the "good" dragon.

During the winter months, their focus was on strength and flexibility at BCAK's exercise and yoga classes. When time and money allowed, they also had the opportunity to practice at a paddling tank.

In April of 2003, the Chestmates acquired their very own magnificent dragon boat, thanks to the generosity of The Andy Fund of Kingston. Then came on-water practices twice a week on the Cataraqui River, docking the dragon boat at the Kingston Canoe Club as soon as the ice was gone.

During the first summer of competition in 2003, the Chestmates took their message of awareness to Dragon Boat Festivals in Peterborough, Belleville, North Bay and Stratford where they competed along with breast cancer survivors from across Ontario as well as in regular women's and mixed team races and the Breast Cancer Survivor Challenge races which are designed to showcase our cause.

The team ended its first full season of paddling in grand style at the Kingston Dragon Boat Festival that September. It was a thrilling moment for them as they streaked across the finish line ahead of six other teams from Ontario and Quebec to win the Breast Cancer Challenge Cup in front of a cheering hometown crowd.

Many new paddlers have joined and retired over the years as have great coaches and steers persons. Our location to dock our wonderful dragon boat and practice changed to Collins Bay Marina and we now enjoy the waters of Collins Bay a part of Lake Ontario. The Chestmates' determination and courage has stood strong throughout the years.

Our 2018 and 2019 seasons became rebuilding years while our comradery stood strong within the spirit of our sistership. At one point we thought we may need to purchase a smaller 10-person boat. Having 6 newbies join in 2019 was helpful as we were not sure how we would afford to purchase a second boat.

Over the years we have continued to deliver our message through participation at annual dragon boat festivals locally and to international breast cancer survivor festivals, including Peterborough, Ontario in 2010 and Sarasota, Florida in 2014. The race towards victory is a symbol of our determination to stand tall and strong against this disease which claims the lives of so many. Dragon boating gives us an opportunity to spread our message of awareness and hope; at the same time, as we paddle our hearts out, we celebrate our lives while doing healthy exercise that boosts our fitness level.

Fast forward to 2020, we were stalled by the COVID-19 Pandemic and were not allowed to be out on the water. We maintained our spirits with ZOOM Meetings and began team walks in the spring of 2021 as things started to open. In August, we were blessed with the ability to get back out on the water. No Festivals this season but boy did we have fun working on our stroke and stamina, being able to be together again and witnessing the beautiful sunsets this September! We were also very fortunate to welcome 7 more very enthusiastic newbies to help fill our boat.

We had a very intriguing lady come out to one of our evening practices to check us out and introduce herself. She said, "Hi, I'm Maggie Daicar. I'm 81 years old and I want to join this fabulous team." Maggie did join us at the beginning of September. She is truly spirited and very young at heart. Shortly after joining us Maggie shared that she had contributed to the Andy Fund back in 2003 through which our 20 person dragon boat was able to be purchased.....at the time Maggie never dreamed that she too would end up being a breast cancer survivor.

In late October we had our season ending potluck at one of our newbies home north of Sydenham. While there Maggie quietly mentioned to a few of us that her partner, Brit Smith, was looking for a birthday gift

idea for her... Maggie's birthday being December 7th. Maggie had heard us discussing the idea of fundraising to purchase a new 10 Person Dragon Boat as an option for training and for those few times when our numbers are low at practice during the busy summer. Maggie said, "I think I have a birthday gift idea for Brit, and I know he will be eager to support my idea." So Maggie went home that evening and told Brit that she had a fabulous idea for her Birthday Gift... Yes, a 10 Person Dragon Boat for the Chestmates. The picture below is of Brit presenting Maggie with a picture of the dragon boat, and a cheque of \$20,000 was made out and delivered to BCAF for the sole purpose of purchasing the dragon boat for our Chestmates Team along with any needed equipment e.g. life jackets, paddles, seat pads etc.



We very much knew there was something special about Maggie Daicar from the moment we met her.

Both Maggie and Brit want to wish all the past and present members of the Chestmates a Safe and Happy Holiday Season and a Happy New Year with this gift for us to continue to spread our message of courage and hope.

From all the past and present Chestmates, Maggie and Brit, we Thank You for the very generous gift which is to arrive in May of 2022...another fun detail for us all is that I was able to order it with PINK scales on the sides.
